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Letter from the **Executive Director**

Dear Friends of PA:

2023 was a year full of twists and turns. As the world starts to find its balance post-Covid, many of us in the nonprofit world have found ourselves doing a complicated dance.

Necessity is truly the mother of invention. During the Covid crisis we built new programs, like our school-based Therapeutic Support Groups and a Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum for afterschool programs. Using adventure as a tool for healing and growth, PA stepped up to fill a gap in mental health supports in our local communities (see "Our Impact," below, to learn how successful those have been!). It's been an exciting few years, finding new ways to use proven tools in a changing world.

Partnerships that were grown during Covid - with districts like Gloucester and Beverly, MA, and with organizations like the YMCA and the Cabot Theatre - are still going strong. But 2023 marked a return to the "old days" of bootstrap fundraising, budget squeezes, and scraping by. We have adjusted accordingly, and even in the face of those squeezes, we continue to grow. But oh, how I dream of a world where our social services are fully funded, where our attention can go 100% to the people who need it!

In the face of all this change, our supporters have stepped up. Our Un-Gala Fundraiser in 2023 was a booming success, our grants doubled, and donations from individuals increased by 30% over previous years.

There's more to be done, but as usual, we don't shy away from a challenge! Theologian Frederick Buechner once wrote that your vocation is "where your deep gladness and the world's deep need meet" and I think that's true for PA. We know how to build joy, connection, healing, and growth, and the world is calling for that right now. I believe that with ingenuity and new supporters, we can meet that need in increasing ways every year!

Did You Know?








2023 Financials

Project Adventure's finances continued to hold stable in 2023. With our board of directors, we made the decision to use some of our resources, particularly from a very strong 2022, to invest in growth, including new technology (a new CRM and computer upgrades) and consulting support for our development program and our strategic plan. We also added key positions (a Director of Education & Training, Senior Manager of Development, and Senior Manager of Operations) as well as additional facilitators that have brought new capacity to our organization, allowing us to both serve more people and refine and develop our programming and curriculum.

The Transformative Power of Adventure

Impact Stories

Therapeutic Adventure

Adventure is fun. Adventure is engaging. Adventure is **healing.** That's what our Therapeutic Adventure Programs (TAP) are built on: adventurous experiences that help groups of students laugh, connect, and grow! In the midst of a national youth mental health crisis, PA has created TAP partnerships at multiple local public schools. In 2023, we facilitated Therapeutic and SEL programs - using adventure to help students build new social skills, connect with peers, and reach their therapeutic goals - at 4 local high schools, 2 local middle schools, 1 early education program, and 3 afterschool programs... reaching more than 600 youth!

Juvenile Justice



Project Adventure facilitators are masters at helping teams of people work better together, and our collaboration with New York City's Administration of Children's Services (ACS) is a prime example. ACS provides a wide range of services to improve the lives of children and families in the juvenile justice system in NYC. In this multi-year collaboration, PA works with the staff of detention centers and diversion programs, leading retreats to support staff wellness, and facilitating a 6-month fellowship for leaders across the system. The fellowship helps managers learn new skills, receive peer support, and develop solutions to their problems of practice. In a big, complex system with a great amount of need, this partnership has been very successful! We combine adventure methods with nonviolent communication, Restorative Justice, and change theory, in a unique and powerful approach to organizational development for a large urban juvenile justice system.

Our Impact By the Numbers

Project Adventure's reach is broad. In 2023, we supported:

- 7,901 youth
- We reached 8% more youth than in 2022!
- 405 challenge courses
- 1,418 adult learners

Surveys of participants in our high-impact TAP programs in 2023 showed...

- 90% of students reported an improvement in their mood or energy
- 74% of students reported a positive or very positive impact on their mental health
- · 89% of students reported an improvement in their ability to regulate their emotions
- 84% of students reported increased confidence in connecting with peers

The Adventure for All Fund



The Adventure for All Fund helps us reduce or eliminate costs to adventure experiences for high-needs communities. In 2023, these funds were used for programs such as Gloucester High School's Anchor and English Learner programs. Both groups were able to come to Project Adventure's challenge course for a day of skill-building and community-building, at no cost to them or their families.
